Introductory note: Dr. Bihini Won wa MUSITI/ PACEBCo Regional Coordinator The Congo Basin tropical forest with its 227 million hectares is the world's second largest tropical rain forest reserve which hosts unique habitats in the world for species of flora and fauna. Considering its key environmental and socio-economic functions, preserving this forest is at the heart of community policies as reflected in the setting up of the Central African Forest Commission (COMIFAC). Unfortunately, countries of the Congo Basin are ranked among the poorest in the world. Poverty is one of the main factors contributing to the degradation of natural resources. The development of income-generating activities (IGA) is a key element in reducing pressure on natural resources. IGAs contribute to alleviate certain ills like inaccessibility, educational wastage, food insecurity and health-related problems,... Sustainably fostering the well-being of the population is a priority in the action plan of the Support Program for the Conservation of Ecosystems in the Congo Basin (PACEBCo) to preserve natural resources. Local Development Funds (LDF) is one of the programs put in place as part of this strategy. The running of LDF has been entrusted to a Regional Operator that is assisted on a landscape scale by Proximity Operators (one Operator per landscape). The goal of this program is to help improve the living conditions of the population living in and/or around the community conserved areas of the landscapes by introducing and fostering income-generating activities through products and services whose beneficial effects will help reduce or even eliminate activities that are a threat to the ecosystems. 2. 	The opening or introductory note: COMIFAC has made the development of a regional atlas on land use part of its 2013-2014 bi-annual work plan. This activity, which is required to strengthen the implementation of strategic priority N° 3 of the convergence plan - Planning forest ecosystem management and reforestation relating to the organization of forest land, is supported by the GIZ-COMIFAC project, notably via its fourth component on space management. This support to space management has led to a three-phase project that will result in the definition of an indicative framework for land use in a bid to draw up zoning plans in each country. The responsibility of completing phases I (starting up) and II (fulfillment) of the said project was entrusted to the German firm, GFA, a Consulting Group that works in close collaboration with OFAC. The project will run from January 15, 2013 to June 30, 2014.
